Latex Construction is writing to inform you of a recent incident that may affect the security of your personal information. We are unaware of any attempted or actual misuse of your personal information, but are providing this notice to ensure that you are aware of the incident, so that you may take steps to protect your information should you feel it is appropriate to do so.

On June 2, 2015, a Safety Coordinator for Latex Construction discovered that his vehicle had been burglarized, while his truck was parked at one of our work sites. The burglar stole the employee's Latex Construction issued laptop and his personal iPad. The information on laptop and the iPad was not password protected or encrypted. Upon learning of the theft, we immediately launched an internal investigation. We contacted local law enforcement, but the laptop and iPad have not been recovered to date.

Latex Construction takes the security of your personal information very seriously. We performed a thorough investigation in order to confirm the nature and scope of this incident. While we have not received any reports of misuse of the information contained on or accessible from the laptop and iPad, there is a possibility that someone may have accessed your personal information, including your name, address, Social Security number, date of birth, and phone number. For some individuals, there is also a possibility that drug test screening results may have also been subject to unauthorized disclosure.

To help protect your identity, we are offering one-year membership of Experian's® ProtectMyID® Alert at no cost to you. This product helps detect possible misuse of your personal information and provides you with superior identity protection support focused on immediate identification and resolution of identity theft.

A credit card is not required for enrollment.

Once your ProtectMyID membership is activated, you will receive the following features:

Once your enrollment in ProtectMyID is complete, you should carefully review your credit report for inaccurate or suspicious items. If you have any questions about ProtectMyID, need help understanding something on your credit report or suspect that an item on your credit report may be fraudulent, please contact Experian's customer care team at 877-297-7780.

We encourage you to remain vigilant, to review your account statements, and to monitor your credit reports and explanation of benefits forms for suspicious activity. Under U.S. law you are entitled to one free credit report annually from each of the three major credit reporting bureaus. To order your free credit report, visit www.annualcreditreport.com or call, toll-free, 1-877-322-8228. You may also contact the three major credit bureaus directly to request a free copy of your credit report.

At no charge, you can also have these credit bureaus place a "fraud alert" on your file that alerts creditors to take additional steps to verify your identity prior to granting credit in your name. Note, however, that because it tells creditors to follow certain procedures to protect you, it may also delay your ability to obtain credit while the agency verifies your identity. As soon as one credit bureau confirms your fraud alert, the others are notified to place fraud alerts on your file. 
